

Hello Again

I already told you about containers to store beads, jewelry projects, etc. Now, I'm going to tell you about a different type of container.

You have your beads and materials stored safely in plastic containers, pill bottles, Zip-lock bags, etc., but what about your instructions, video tutorials, patterns, pictures of finished jewelry, or ideas for jewelry you would like to make? Flash drives and memory cards make excellent containers to keep all of your information safe and secure.

There's another handy tool that can aid in the process. It's free software that puts a virtual printer on your computer. "PDF redirect" acts as a printer that you can choose when you click on PRINT that will convert any document into a PDF file and save it anywhere on your computer, or on a portable drive. Below is a link to a search page that will give you choices of sites to download this software, and also a tutorial on how to use it:

Copy and paste this address in the address box of your browser, if the link doesn't work.

You can make folders for the different categories of jewelry making, i.e. BEADWORK, METALWORK, CHAINMAILLE, etc. You can subdivide the folders under the separate categories: eBooks, videos, PDFs. Buy the drive with the most memory you can afford (videos can really eat up space). Designate the drive just for that purpose. Voila! Your container!

You can subscribe to the various newsletters that are available by email, I get them all! When you find one that interests you, that has an article or instructions you want to keep.

right click on it before you open it, and choose PRINT PREVIEW. The email will open as if to be printed. You can then count the number of pages, and choose the pages you actually want to save and eliminate pages with the ads. Then choose PRINT, the number of pages, and "PDFreDirect" as your printer. Save the article under the appropriate category and subfolder, and you're all set. When setting up your printer, be sure to check VIEW IN PDF READER AFTER SAVING.

You can also COPY an article or instructions you find online and PASTE it into WORD or other word processing program, and click FILE and SAVE AS to save it in your folders. Don't forget to change the file name, if necessary, so you can identify the article when searching for it later.

Well, when I started, I expected this to be a short tip, and I also wanted to add a few hints specifically related to jewelry making, but I'd better save them for next time, as this one has grown to epic proportions. I'll also tell you how to download and save online video tutorials on You Tube. There's a treasure trove out there. Better get two flash drives!
