Copper Brazing Workshop



Want to learn a metal technique called copper brazing? If you do, come to the Link Center in Tupelo on **Saturday, January 14th**. NMGMS will be having a mixed metals class, upstairs in the conference room, from **10a.m. until 4p.m.** You will learn how to create a prong type bezel or frame for a stone, using copper wire and brazing rods. Slab Saw and Cabochon workshop

There will be a lapidary workshop in our room at the Link Center in Tupelo on Saturday January 14th, room#136. NMGMS member, Mike Schuchs will be conducting a slab saw safety and operation workshop at 10a.m. for those members interested. Bring some stones that you would like to slab. Be sure the rough material isn't too small or too large to be clamped into the saw's rock vise (5" x 6 1/2" capacity vise). The 14inch saw is running and also two 10 inch saws. Two trim saws will also be in operation, so you will be able to draw a cabochon out on a slab that you have and would like to trim. We have a box of slabs that you can "play" with, if you don't have any of your own. Roger Lambert will also be doing a cabochon demo and giving lessons on the Genie machine.

The workshop space is limited, so sign up early. Please bring a brown bag lunch.

The first NMGMS field trip for 2017 will be on **Saturday Jan. 21st** to collect Mississippian fossils from the Bangor Formation. We will be collecting fossils such as bryozoans, blastoids, brachiopods, and corals. We will meet at the gas station/convenience store in Belgreen, AL on Hwy 24 and 187, approximately 17 miles east of Red Bay, AL. at **9:00** a.m. Bring small containers, cardboard flats and a bucket for carrying your fossils and gear.

Newspapers, paper towels or aluminum foil is recommended for wrapping up those that are

fragile. A rock hammer, chisel and something to pry with is also handy to have. Wear boots or shoes that can get wet or muddy and bring a hat, water, sunscreen, safety glasses, etc. A backpack or extra bucket is good to have, since we will be walking and carrying our gear with us. Paleontological Resources Preservation Act

P.L. 111-011 Omnibus Public Land Management Act of 2009

Subtitle D--Paleontological Resources Preservation

Rin: 1093-AA16 Document3: 2016-29244

This Preservation Act puts in place rules and regulations on the collecting of fossils on federal lands, including those managed by the Bureau of Land Management, the Bureau of Reclamations, the Fish and Wildlife Services and the National Forest Service. It is a rather lengthy and not always easily understood document, but all fossil collectors should at least be familiar with it. Check out **Subparts A, B, D, and I**

The Bureau of Land Management, Bureau of Reclamation, National Park Service, and the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service are in the process of review and finalization. Public comments must be received by Feb. 6, 2017. It appears that the NFS has completed their review and has issued the final rule. See the links below for details.
