We did not know what to expect from a trip to a coal mine. I had fears of wandering around all day looking for something that might or might not have been a collectable fossil. The finds were amazing.


There is no doubt that from the short period we were on site enough material was collected to keep us all busy through the winter cleaning, preserving and labeling our treasures.


